## C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

### C.1. Compliance with the Constitution and Rules of Olympic Council of Asia and other relevant rules

All athletes must respect and comply with the Constitution and Rules of Olympic Council of Asia (“Rule”) currently in force. Only those athletes who respect and comply with the Rules, the World Anti- Doping Code, and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions, including the conditions of participation established by the OCA, plus the rules of World Climbing, may participate in the Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026.

### C.2. Additional IF/AF eligibility criteria

All participating athletes must comply with World Climbing Rules and relevant regulations ([link](#)) and the following:

- To be eligible to participate in the Asian Games 2026, athletes must be born on or before 31 December 2009 (i.e., at least 17 years old in 2026).
- Hold a valid international license issued by World Climbing during the qualification period and the year of Asian Games 2026.
- Not have been banned from participating in any World Climbing competitions during the qualification period and the year of Asian Games 2026.

## D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

### D.1. Quota places

The qualification events are listed in hierarchical order of qualification.

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Contingency qualification pathway: If the quota places remain unfilled after **D. Qualification Pathway**, all unused quota places will be allocated based on the 2025 World Climbing Championship results.

## **D.2. Host NOC Places**

In the case where the host NOC does not qualify any athlete per gender through the **D. Qualification Pathway**, one (1) quota place will be allocated to the highest placed athlete from the host NOC at the 2025 IFSC World Championships, respecting the max. NOC quota per gender per event.

In case there are no eligible athletes from the host NOC at the 2025 IFSC World Climbing Championships, one (1) quota place will be firstly allocated to the highest placed athlete from the host NOC at the 2026 World Climbing Asia Championship, respecting the max. NOC quota per gender per event.

## **E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS OF QUOTA PLACES**

### **E.1. Confirmation of quota places**

World Climbing Asia will publish the results of the event on the World Climbing [website](#).

World Climbing Asia will confirm in writing to the NOCs within three (3) days after the end of each qualifying events, the quota places they have obtained. The NOCs will then inform World Climbing Asia if they wish to confirm or decline these quota places as detailed in section **H. Qualification Timeline**.

### **E.2. Confirmation of quota places**

In case where the host NOC did not qualify any athletes through the **D. Qualification Pathway**, World Climbing Asia will send a request to the host NOC as outlined in section **H. Qualification Timeline**.

World Climbing Asia will ask to the NOC if they wish to use the host NOC place for the eligible athlete(s), applicable per gender, as described under section **D.2 Host NOC Places**, and the NOC will then confirm to World Climbing Asia if they wish to use such quota place.

## **F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES**

### **F.1. Reallocation of unused quota places**

If an event is canceled or the quota places remained unfilled after 2025 IFSC World Championships pathway outlined in section **D. Qualification Pathway**, the unused quota place(s) will be reallocated to the next highest ranked eligible athlete, not yet qualified, at the 2026 World Climbing Asia Championship, respecting the maximum quota per gender per NOC.

Any further unused quota place(s) will be reallocated to the next highest placed eligible athlete, not yet qualified, at the 2025 IFSC World Championships, respecting the maximum quota per gender per NOC.

The reallocation will be implemented according to the timeline expressed in section **H. Qualification Timeline**.

### F.2. Reallocation of unused host NOC quota places

Unused host NOC quota place(s) will be reallocated to the next highest placed eligible athlete, not yet qualified, at the 2025 IFSC World Championships, respecting the maximum quota per gender and per NOC. If the event is canceled or the quota places remained unfilled after 2025 IFSC World Championships pathway outlined in section **D. Qualification Pathway**, the unused quota place(s) will be reallocated to the next highest ranked eligible athlete, not yet qualified, at the 2026 World Climbing Asia Championship, respecting the maximum quota per gender per NOC.

The reallocation will be implemented according to the timeline expressed in section **H. Qualification Timeline**.
