#### 1.1. Introduction to the guide

This document serves as stakeholder guide for the Olympic Qualifier Series, the landmark event in the lead-up to the Olympic Games Paris 2024, featuring a new, festival-style series, combining sport with urban culture in the dynamic cities of Shanghai and Budapest. The guide aims to provide comprehensive and essential information for all stakeholders involved for the event in Shanghai.

The Olympic Qualifier Series stakeholder guide is designed to assist all stakeholders involved in the Olympic Qualifier Series, including Team Delegations, International Federations (IFs), Media, Local Organising Committee (LOC) staff and volunteers, Partners, Hospitality clients, Spectators, and the IOC. It provides detailed information on various aspects of the Shanghai event

Set against the urban landscapes of Shanghai at the Huangpu Riverside from 16 – 19 May 2024 and Budapest at the Ludovika Campus from 20 – 23 June 2024, the Series promises a vibrant atmosphere blending athletic prowess with cultural festivities. The conclusion of the Olympic Qualifier Series coincides with Olympic Day, marking a celebratory end to the qualification period for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

## **VENUE**

The Olympic Qualifier Series will be hosted in a singular Urban Park, offering a unique and integrated setting for all events. This central location, located at the 68 Longhua East Road in Shanghai, facilitates easy access to various activities, ensuring a seamless and immersive experience for athletes, officials, and spectators.

## **ACCOMMODATION**

#### 4.1 Hotel practical information

The LOC has selected hotels for all stakeholder groups, strategically located in close proximity to each other and the Huangpu Riverside where the event will take place. These hotels provide convenient access to the Urban Park via dedicated shuttle services. Situated in downtown Shanghai, the hotels are easily accessible by public transport and proximate to the business district. Each hotel room features central air conditioning, free wi-fi, toilet and bathroom, and comprehensive amenities.

The LOC will provide the accredited athletes with accommodation in a twin room, with breakfast, free of charge.

#### 4.2 Reservation and cancellation policy

All accommodation reservations must be submitted by 21 April 2024. The LOC will secure rooms based on the booking information provided in the registration portal. Stakeholders responsible for their accommodation costs must submit credit card details and an authorisation form to facilitate a deposit upon hotels' request. Free cancellation is available 48 hours prior check-in.

Accommodation costs for guests covered by the LOC include only the room charges; any incidental expenses incurred during the stay must be paid by the guests themselves. Stakeholders responsible for their own accommodation fees can settle all charges directly with the hotel, with invoices being provided upon check-out. Accommodation requests can be made from 11 March until 21 April. After this date, it becomes the responsibility of individuals to find and book their own accommodation.



## **ACCREDITATION**

#### 5.1. Application process

Registration for the Shanghai stop will commence on March 11, and conclude on 21 April 2024. Each organisation's contact person involved in the event, including individuals in certain cases, will receive an invitation to access the registration portal. Accompanying the invitation, an Olympic Qualifier Series Registration System Technical Guide will be provided, detailing the step-by-step process for completing the registration.

#### 5.2 Visa

The Olympic Qualifier Series accreditation cards will not serve as a visa and will not be mailed prior to the event. It is the responsibility of each accredited individual to verify the documents required for entry into China.

For complete and up-to-date visa information, please refer to the <u>Chinese Visa Application Center</u>. Obtaining your visa from the Embassy or Consulate of China well in advance is essential. Ensure that all necessary procedures are completed within the required timeframe.

Participants in need of a visa can request a Visa Invitation Letter from the LOC via the registration portal. This letter is intended to support your visa application. We recommend requesting this as soon as possible for timely processing. To ensure sufficient processing time, it is advised to request your Visa Support Letter by March 29, 2024. While requests made after this date will still be processed and a Visa Support Letter provided, the timely arrival of visas cannot be guaranteed. Upon completion of registration, the Visa Support Letter will be made available through the registration portal, and you will be notified via email.

Before requesting the Visa Support Letter, identify the embassy or consulate where you will apply for the visa. After completing your registration, it will take approximately 10 working days for the LOC to issue the invitation letter. If you do not receive your letter within this timeframe or have any inquiries regarding the visa support letter, please contact the LOC at ogs\_shanghai\_visa@163.com.

#### 5.3 Accreditation collection

Accreditation for the Olympic Qualifier Series can be collected upon arrival at the event. A designated collection point will be set up to facilitate easy access for all attendees. Detailed information, including the specific locations of the accreditation office(s) and operating hours, will be communicated closer to the event.

Participants must present the following identification documents to collect their accreditation badges:

- A valid passport
- Condition of Participation, only for applicable persons

For group collection, the same identification requirements apply.

Accreditation badges are essential for access to all event areas and must be worn visibly at all times during the Olympic Qualifier Series.

#### 5.5 Stole and damaged accreditation process

In the event of stolen or damaged accreditation badges, report to the accreditation office as soon as possible. If an accreditation card is believed to have been stolen, the potential theft should be reported to the nearest accreditation office as soon as possible.

## **MEDIA**

#### 6.1 Media facilities and services

The media centre is located in the Urban Park at the Huangpu Riverside, where all sports competitions and activities will take place. It will be operational from 15 to 19 May 2024.

Other media facilities in the Urban Park include mixed zones, and camera- and photo positions. There will be limited Media Rights Holder camera positions at each field of play (FOP) available on a first-come, first-served basis.

#### 6.2 Mixed zone

There will be a mixed zone adjacent to each FOP for accredited media to conduct short interviews with the athletes as they leave the FOP after competition. The mixed zone will have a specific broadcast and press section.

#### 6.3 Olympic Information Services (OIS)

The Olympic Information Service (OIS) is a professional sports reporting and information service designed to assist the media covering the Olympic Qualifier Series.

OIS will produce ready-to-use content on the competitions, and the athletes. OIS content will be published on a dedicated page of the Olympic Qualifier Series website (Olympics.com/ois) and will be available license-free for republishing and distribution for editorial purposes.

OIS Photo is a professional sports photography service designed to capture the best moments of the Olympic Qualifier Series and share them with a global audience. All photos produced by the OIS photo team will be made available license-free via <a href="www.oisphotos.com">www.oisphotos.com</a> to media worldwide.

All content produced by OIS is made available for free to media worldwide, as well as to the International Federations and National Federations.
OIS will be in production from 15 to 19 May 2024.



## **FESTIVAL AND CEREMONIES**

The Olympic Qualifier Series is not just a qualification event, it is a new Olympic experience for athletes and fans around the world. The Urban Festival complements the sports competition and comprises a series of activities related to music, arts, and culture, and reflects an urban sports lifestyle and showcases the energy and creativity of Shanghai.

#### 7.1 Festival area

#### 7.2 Victory ceremonies

The victory ceremony is staged after each final to honour athletes who place first, second and third and to award trophies. The ceremony is usually held immediately after the event at or next to the competition venue. Exact locations will be defined depending on the venue set-up.

#### 7.3 Sports initiation

As part of the Urban Festival, a sports initiation programme focused on the Olympic Qualifier Series sports will be managed by the LOC. It gives spectators the chance to learn about, play and engage with the different sports. Sports initiation will take place in a dedicated zone in the Urban Park. Immersive Olympic experiences will be tailored for the audience, integration sports experiences centred around the four sports part of the Olympic Qualifier Series. More detailed information will be provided in V2 of the Olympic Qualifier Series guide.



## **FOOD AND BEVERAGE**

#### 8.1 Hotel meals

All Olympic Qualifier Series hotels will provide buffet dining options for breakfast (6:30 – 10:00) and dinner (18:00 – 21:00), designed to accommodate a variety of dietary needs. Breakfast will be exclusively available at the hotels for all stakeholders, breakfast services will not be available at the Urban Park.

#### 8.2 Athlete and team officials venue meals

For athletes, team officials and chaperones, buffet-style meals will be available at the Urban, with lunch served from 11:00 to 14:00 and dinner from 18:00 to 21:00. From May 14th to May 15th, lunch will be served at the Urban Park and dinner at their respective hotels. Then, from May 16th to May 19th, both lunch and dinner will be served at the Urban Park.

Further details on meal prices and payment methods will be provided in the next version of the Olympic Qualifier Series guide.

#### 8.3 ITOs and IF delegates

ITOs and IF delegates can access specially catered meals at the venue locations. These meals will be served at the IOC and IFs break area with lunch available from 11:00 to 14:00 and dinner from 18:00 to 21:00. On May 14th to May 15th, lunch will be provided at the IOC and IFs break area, and dinner arrangements will be made at the hotels. From May 16th to May 19th, ITOs and IF delegates will have access to both lunch and dinner at the IOC and IFs break area. The LOC will also offer portable food options specifically for ITOs during these days. Further details on meal prices and payment methods will be provided in the next version of the Olympic Qualifier Series guide.

## MEDICAL AND ANTI-DOPING

#### 10.1 Service available

Urgent and Emergency Care medical services have been established for the Olympic Qualifier Series to ensure the safety of all stakeholders. This includes an on-site mobile hospital equipped with CT and surgical carts, capable of conducting radiological investigations and immediate life-saving surgical interventions; five medical points established within the competition venues supported by appropriately qualified healthcare staff; three medical points will be set up in public areas and parking lots, offering basic medical services to both spectators and staff. For emergencies requiring rapid transport, a fleet of ambulances will be deployed across the Urban Park to transport to either the onsite emergency care mobile units or onward to the designated hospital. Hotel medical support details will be provided in V2 of the Olympic Qualifier Series guide.

#### 10.2 Physio

#### 10.3 Hospitals

For medical emergencies, the LOC has designated Huashan Hospital to provide 24-hour medical emergency services to athletes and officials. Additionally, three healthcare facilities are available to offer continuous medical emergency coverage for spectators and staff members.

#### 10.4 Doping control

#### 10.5 Insurance

All accredited persons must have accident, health, and repatriation insurance to cover their medical expenses in the host city/country.

It is the responsibility of the participating individuals and/or the NF to arrange insurance to provide coverage for their health or injuries during travel to and from the Olympic Qualifier Series Event, as well as throughout the event. The insurance should cover the risks associated with claims by third parties, personal injury, bodily injury or death. Kindly ensure you take the appropriate actions to meet these obligations well ahead of time.

Ambulance services are available to facilitate a swift medical response. Six ambulances will be deployed at Urban Park: one at each of the FOPs, one at the mobile hospital, and one more in the public area.

#### 12.1.3 Use of NF/NOC Emblem

As an exception for the Olympic Qualifier Series (not the Olympic Games Paris 2024), one NF emblem could be included on uniforms in addition to, or instead of, the NOC emblem. If the uniform has the NOC and NF emblem, the NF emblem should be no more prominent than the NOC emblem. If there is no NOC emblem, there is no size restriction applied to the NF emblem. The NF emblem must not include a commercial logo.

The use of the NOC emblem is subject to prior approval by the respective NOC. This could include either (i) the institutional or (ii) the commercial emblem of a participating NOC, as approved by the IOC, or the emblem of the NF, as approved by the respective IF.

#### 12.1.4 Compliance

IFs have the overall responsibility of ensuring compliance with these guidelines whilst on the FOP (training, warm-up and competition), podium and mixed zones. The LOC is responsible for ensuring compliance outside of these areas. Additionally, NFs must ensure that their delegation is informed sufficiently in advance about these guidelines and complies with them.

## **TICKETING**

#### 13.1 Spectator tickets

13.1.1 Ticket type

For the event, two main types of tickets are available: Sports tickets and Festival tickets.

Sport tickets are available for a specific sport session each day, granting access to the Urban Park and specific competition venue. These tickets allow holders to watch competition and participate in park activities. Sport ticket holders do not need an additional festival ticket for park entry. Seating is on a general admission basis, operating on a first-come, first-served selection by spectators. Re-entry to the competition venue or Urban Park is not permitted with these tickets.

Festival tickets offer access to the Urban Park for either one or four days, allowing entry to various activities within the park but not including access to the sport competitions. Competitions can be viewed on a big screen in the Urban Park. Reentry to the Urban Park is not permitted with these tickets.

#### 14.1.3 Stakeholders ticket policy

Prices for tickets range from CNY 49 to CNY 488, accommodating a variety of options for attendees. Every Stakeholders have the opportunity to request and purchase tickets in two distinct phases to accommodate their needs and preferences:

Pre-Sale Phase: During this initial phase, stakeholders are invited to request both Complimentary (if permitted) and Paid Tickets through an offline Request Form distributed by the LOC. The allocation process for tickets will occur subsequently, taking into account the total inventory available and the summary of requests received.

Real-time Sale Phase: After the initial request phase, stakeholders have the option to directly place orders and pay for any additional tickets on-line at the Olympic Qualifier Series Shanghai ticketing website provided by Damai, subject to the availability of sellable ticket inventory. The number of tickets available for purchase by stakeholders will be contingent upon the real-time inventory status at the point of sale.

Athletes will have the opportunity to view all sports competitions free of charge in a designated area in the grandstands. Please note that seating is subject to availability and capacity, and a seat is not guaranteed.

#### 14.1 Athletes flight booking procedure

Athletes and NFs are responsible for making their own travel arrangements. To offset the costs associated with travel of accredited athletes to the Olympic Qualifier Series, a travel grant system will be in place to support the athletes to travel to the events. IFs will be responsible for providing the funds to the NFs/athletes. Athletes should contact their National Federation for more details.

#### 14.2 Arrivals and departure

For accredited individuals attending Olympic Qualifier Series in Shanghai, the designated ports of entry are as follows:

- Shanghai Pu Dong International Airport (PVG)
- Shanghai Hongqiao Airport (SHA)
- Shanghai Hongqiao Railway Station

Transfers between the ports of entry/exit – Pudong Airport (PVG), Hongqiao Airport (SHA), Shanghai Railway Station and Hongqiao railway station – and the hotels will be arranged based on information provided in the accreditation system.

#### 14.3 Public transport

This information will be shared at a later stage.



## **TRANSPORT**

#### 14.4 Shuttle services

The shuttle service operated by the Shanghai LOC will be a shared bus service connecting the Urban Park and the Olympic Qualifier Series accommodations. Shuttle schedules and routes will be displayed on information boards at both the hotels and Urban Park. There will be volunteers at the hotels to support with any inquiries or transportation-related needs. Accredited personnel not staying in the Olympic Qualifier Series hotels will be able to make use of the transportation services. It's estimated that all routes operated by the shuttle service will have an approximate journey time of 25 minutes.



## **TECHNOLOGY**

#### 15.1 Internet

Access to the global public Internet will be available to all international accredited individuals within the Urban Park. Wireless internet (Wi-Fi) will be available in all key operational spaces. For certain stakeholders with specific requirements, wired internet connections will be provided.

#### 15.2 Mobile network

Comprehensive mobile network coverage will be ensured across the entire Urban Park, facilitating the use of mobile network services by all accredited stakeholders and spectators. The coverage will include all local Mobile Network Operators (MNO) within Shanghai, such as: China Telecom, China Unicom, China Mobile. These operators will provide 4G and 5G mobile network coverage throughout both outdoor and indoor areas of the Urban Park.

#### 15.3 Radio frequencies

Accredited Olympic Qualifier Series stakeholders who intend to use wireless transmitting equipment during the event are required to apply for Radio Frequencies for their equipment. The deadline for the Radio Frequency application submission was 08 March 2024. If there are additional requests post the deadline, those should be urgently submitted to the LOC, however it won't be guaranteed, as there is 3 weeks review process.

#### **Breaking**

#### Pre-Selection

- The 40 athletes are seeded into 10 heats.
- Each athlete in the heat performs individually and is scored by each judge on a scale of 0 to 100 (0.1-point increments). The highest and lowest judge scores are discarded, and the remaining scores averaged to give a final score of 0 to 100.
- The 40 athletes are ranked based on pre-selection score and event seeding.
- The top 32 ranked athletes advance to the Pre-Qualifier phase.
- The remaining athletes are eliminated and ranked based on their Pre-Selection ranking.

#### Pre-Qualifier:

- The athletes are seeded into 16 battles.
- Each knock-out battle consists of two rounds plus an additional round if both athletes have won the same number of rounds and votes during the battle.
- The athletes are assigned to red and blue sides by random draw.
- The 16 battle winners advance to the Round Robin phase and are seeded for the Round Robin based on rounds won in Pre-Qualifier (excluding any additional third rounds), votes won in Pre-Qualifier (excluding any from any additional third rounds), Pre-Selection ranking and finally by pre-competition seeding.

#### **Round Robin:**

- There are four groups of four athletes. Each athlete competes in three battles in the Round Robin. The group composition is determined based on Pre-Qualifier Ranking:
  - o Group A: 1, 8, 9, 16
  - o Group B: 2, 7, 10, 15
  - Group C: 3, 6, 11, 14
  - o Group D: 4, 5, 12, 13
- The order of battles within each group is determined by the "battle pools" defined in the WDSF Breaking Rules and Regulations Manual.
- In each battle, athletes are assigned to the red or blue side by computerised random draw
- Each battle consists of two rounds. In all battles, the athlete designated as "Blue" can decide whether to perform first, or to allow their opponent "Red" to perform first. The second athlete then responds.
- During the Round Robin, scores become available at the end of each round.
- Athletes are ranked within each group by the number of rounds won and judges' votes collected and finally by Pre-Selection Ranking.
- At the end of the Round Robin, the best two athletes in each group progress to the Quarterfinals. The remaining athletes are ranked 9th to 16th, by the number of rounds won, the number of votes collected, Pre-Selection Ranking and finally by pre-competition seeding.

#### Knock-out:

- Each Knock-out battle consists of three rounds. The athlete with more rounds at the end of the battle is declared the winner.
- In each battle, athletes are assigned to the red or blue side depending on their position in the bracket.
- During the Knock-out, scores become available at the end of the battle.
- The athlete designated as "Blue" can decide whether to perform first, or to allow their opponent "Red" to perform first. The second athlete then responds.
- The losing quarterfinalists are ranked 5th to 8th by the total number of rounds won in the Knock-out, total number of votes collected in the Knockout, rounds won in the Round Robin, votes collected in the Round Robin, Pre-Qualifier Ranking, Pre-Selection Ranking and finally by pre-competition seeding.
- The losing semi-finalists contest the bronze medal battle, and the winning semi-finalists contest the gold medal battle.



#### **BMX** freestyle

#### Qualification

- The 24 female or male riders compete in four heats of 6 riders.
- The start order in each heat will be provided by the UCI (based on the UCI Ranking).
- Riders perform 2 runs per heat, in the same start order.
- The rider's result is calculated on the average score of the two runs.
- The first 12 riders from the combined ranking of the Qualification heats qualify to the Final.

#### Final

- The start order of the Final is based on the reverse order of the Qualification results, with the riders ranked 7-12 placed in the first heat, and the riders ranked 1-6 placed in the second heat.
- Should the final be cancelled, the Qualification ranking will stand as the event result.



#### Skateboarding

#### **Prelims**

- The 44 female or male skaters compete in four heats of 11 skaters.
- The start order of the Prelim is based on the reverse order of the OWSR rank.
- The first 16 skaters from the combined ranking of the heats qualify to the Semifinal.

#### Semifinal

- In the Semifinal, skaters compete in two heats of eight skaters.
- The start order of the Semifinal is based on the reverse order of the Prelims results.
- The first eight skaters from the combined ranking of the heats qualify to the final.

#### Final

 The start order of the Final is based on the reverse order of the Semifinal results.



#### **Sport climbing**

Boulder & Lead

- Athletes compete in two stages that are combined into a single ranking. The
  event comprises three phases, Qualification, Semifinal and Final, each with a
  Boulder and a Lead stage.
- 20 athletes progress from Qualification to Semifinals. In case of tie for the 20th place, both will progress to the Semifinals.
- At the end of the Semifinal phase, the eight highest ranked athletes progress
  to the Final phase. The athlete with the highest Final ranking, combining
  points from Boulder and Lead stages, will win the competition. Points are not
  carried over from the Semifinal phase to the Final phase.

#### Speed

#### Qualification


- Each athlete may make two runs, one on Lane A (the left lane) and one on Lane B (the right lane). Any athlete failing to make at least one attempt will not be ranked in the phase.
- The starting order for the seeding heats is randomised. Half the start list start on Lane A, the second half on Lane B, changing lanes after the first run.
- Any athlete recording a False Start will be ranked last in the phase. However, they will not keep their other race result (obtained in Lane A or Lane B) to split their ranking.

#### Final Phase

- The Final phase consists of a series of elimination rounds: 1/8 Finals,
   Quarterfinals, Semifinals, Finals (Small and Big Final).
- In each round, the winner of each heat progresses to the next round and the loser is eliminated.
