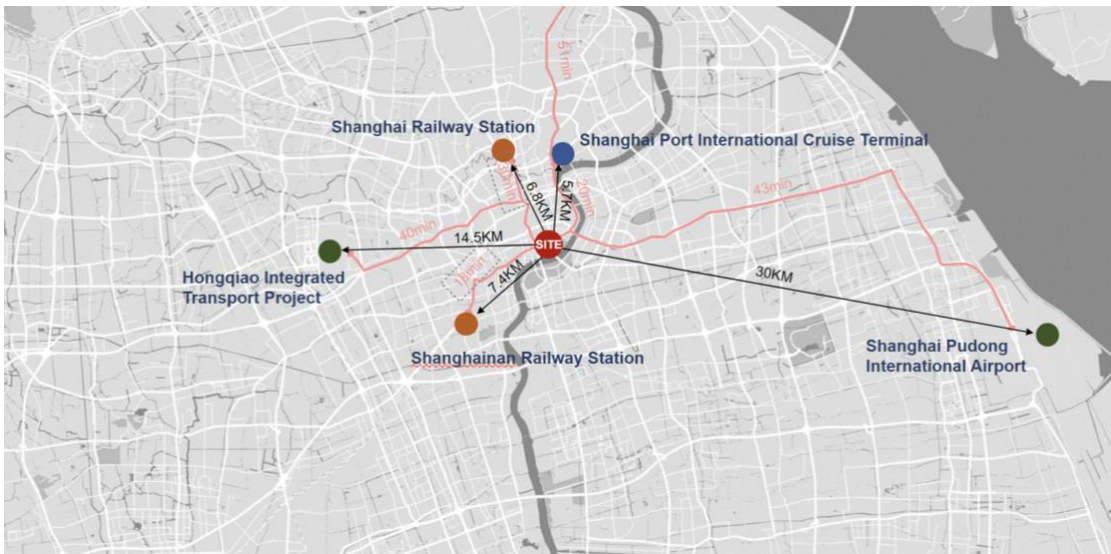

1. OQS Fact Sheet

Break. Ride. Skate. Climb. The ultimate stage for athletes to qualify for Paris 2024 is coming to Shanghai and Budapest in the first ever Olympic Qualifier Series! The two-part series, taking place in the period leading up to the Olympic Games Paris 2024, will be an important step in determining which athletes qualify in BMX freestyle, breaking, skateboarding and sport climbing for Paris 2024.

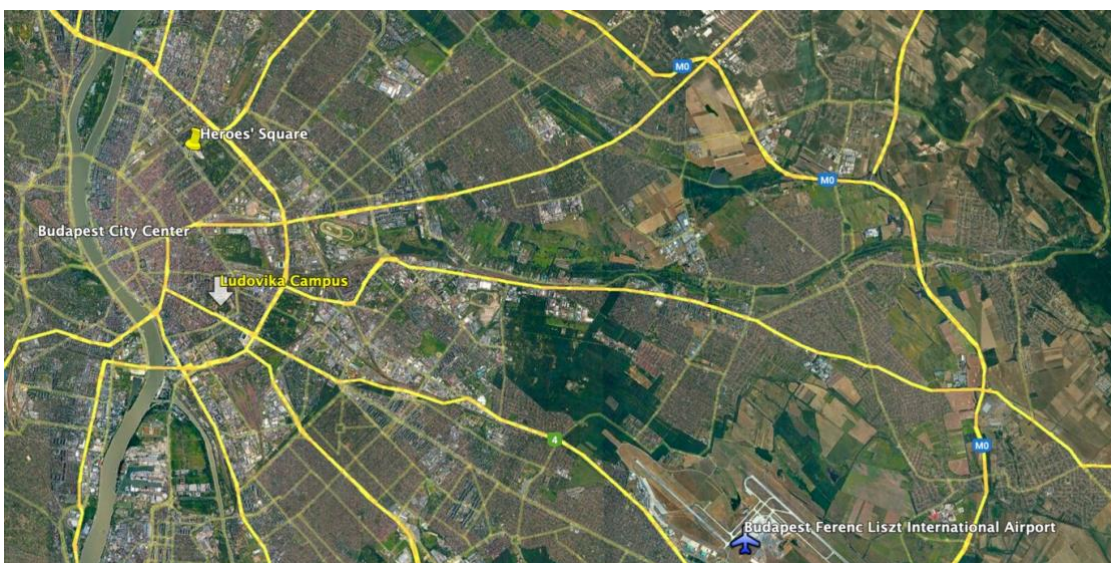

2. Athlete Travel Grant and accommodation

Athlete Travel Grant

To offset the costs associated with travel of accredited athletes to the OQS, a travel grant system will be in place to support the athletes to travel to the events. This travel grant will be organised directly between each of the LOCs and the IFs. The LOCs will provide the funds to the IFs, and the IFs will be responsible for providing the funds to the NFs/athletes.

- The travel grant is only applicable for accredited athletes that have participated in a stage of the OQS.
- The travel grant will be paid to the NFs/athletes from the IF following the completion of the event.
- The travel grant amount per athlete, per country, will be communicated by the IFs to the NFs/athletes after 20 February 2024.

Accommodation

Each Organising Committee will also provide the athlete's accommodation in a twin room, with breakfast, free of charge. The room allocation is twin rooms, same sport, and same gender.

Arrival and departure

Teams are expected to arrive one day before training, and leave one day after their competition ends, of their event/discipline.

- **Boulder & Lead : arrival 13th May, departure 20th May**
- **Speed : arrival 14th May, departure 19th May**

If any of the teams wish to arrive earlier or stay longer, the request is subject to room availability, and Athletes' accommodation / extra nights will have to be covered by the NF. Moreover, there will be no early access to the Urban Park other than on the planned training days.

Athletes will also be provided accreditation and a visa support letter, plus access to the OQS transport system to enable them to travel between their arrival and departure points, accommodation, and the venue.

3. NF/Team delegation size

3.1. Team Officials

Each NF is intitled to the following number of Team Officials:

Athletes	Team Officials
1-6	up to 3
7-12	up to 5
13+	up to 7

Team Official entitlements:

- Assistance with accreditation and a visa support letter (if applicable).
- Assistance with hotel rooms in the team delegation accommodation (cost of rooms born by the user)
- Access to OQS shuttles (if applicable).
- Access to the venue and the necessary area for their role.

3.2. NF Guests

Each NF is entitled to 1 NF Guest accreditation once in one of the 2 OQS stops (NFs to decide which stop).

Team Delegation Guest entitlements:

- Assistance with accreditation and a visa support letter (if applicable).
- Access to hospitality and stands.
- All other associated costs (air travel, food & beverage, accommodation, public transport etc.) will be on a user-pay basis and at the own arrangement.

3.3. Chaperones

In the context of OQS, child athletes are defined as persons under 16 years of age at the time of the last date of the OQS series (23 June 2024). A Chaperone accreditation will be available for each entered athlete that is considered a child athlete. This accreditation is in addition to the Team Official accreditation mentioned above.

Chaperone entitlements:

- Access to the Urban Park (incl. Sport area).
- Access to OQS transport system.
- All other associated costs (air travel, food and beverage, accommodation, etc.) will be on a user pay basis.
- If a Chaperone is the athlete's parent, they could be accommodated together with the athlete, on the basis that the Chaperone will cover the cost of their part of the room.

Further details on accommodation for the team delegations at both events, plus the booking and payment process will be communicated shortly.

4. Identification on Team Apparel

For the Olympic Qualifier Series (OQS), all athletes and officials must comply with the following guidelines while on the **FoP** (training, warm-up, and competition), **podium** and **mixed zones**:

Use of NF/NOC Emblem

As an exception for the OQS (not the Olympic Games Paris 2024), one NF emblem could be included on uniforms in addition to, or instead of, the NOC emblem. If the uniform has the NOC and NF emblem, the NF emblem should be no more prominent than the NOC emblem. If there is no NOC emblem, there is no size restriction applied to the NF emblem. The NF emblem must not include a commercial logo.

The use of the NOC emblem is subject to prior approval by the respective NOC. This could include either (i) the institutional or (ii) the commercial emblem of a participating NOC, as approved by the IOC, or the emblem of the NF, as approved by the respective IF.

Compliance

IFs have the overall responsibility of ensuring compliance with these guidelines during the OQS events. Additionally, NFs must ensure that their delegation is informed sufficiently in advance about these guidelines and complies with them.

5. Registration process

Each IF will complete the entries process for their events at the OQS and following this, NFs will be given access to the registration portal from 18 March 2024. Each NF must nominate a person who is responsible for completing the registration process for their team delegation. This person should be confirmed to the IF prior to 10 March 2024.

NFs will be invited to complete the information for their team delegation and then, visa letters will be issued via the registration portal within approximately 14 days.
