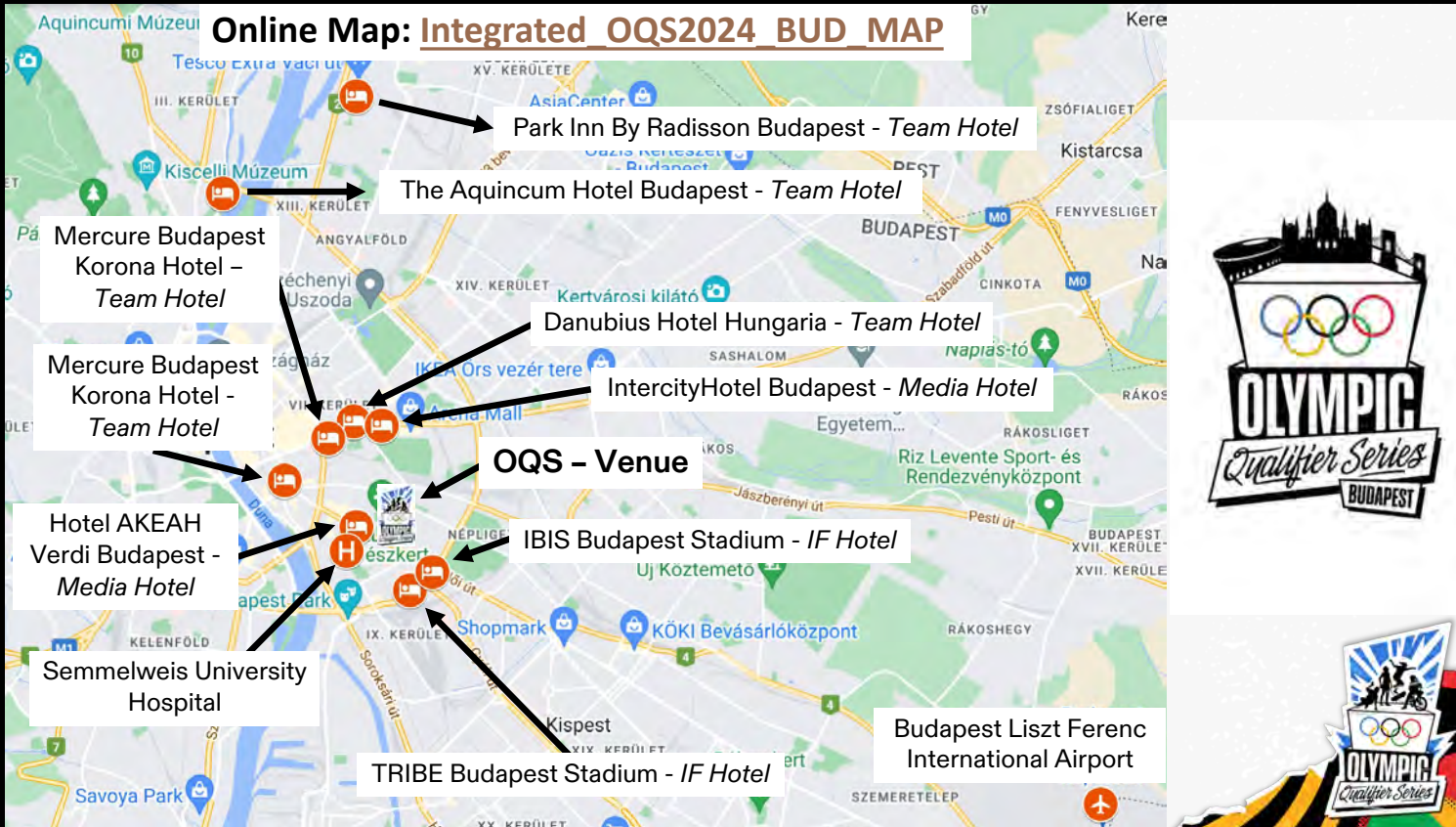

3.2 Athletes club

The Athletes Club will serve as a dedicated area for athletes to relax and prepare. It is situated centrally in the Urban Park and will feature a F&B area, a chill out and outside play space, and a terrace to provide a comfortable environment for athletes during their downtime. DJ will play music on Technics turntables all day long.

Athletes will also have access to changing rooms facilities designed with their comfort and privacy in mind. These facilities are equipped with toilets and showers.

ACCREDITATION

5.1. Application process

Registration for the Budapest stop will commence on 19 April and conclude on 27 May (11:59 CET). Each organisation's contact person involved in the event, including individuals in certain cases, will receive an invitation to access the registration portal. Accompanying the invitation, an Olympic Qualifier Series Registration System Technical Guide will be provided, detailing the step-by-step process for completing the registration.

5.2 Visa

The Olympic Qualifier Series accreditation cards will not serve as a visa and will not be mailed prior to the event. It is the responsibility of each accredited individual to verify the documents required for entry into Hungary.

For complete and up-to-date visa information, please refer to [this infosheet](#). Obtaining your visa from the Embassy or Consulate of Hungary well in advance is essential. Ensure that all necessary procedures are completed within the required timeframe.

Participants in need of a visa can request a Visa Invitation Letter from the LOC via the registration portal. This letter is intended to support your visa application. We recommend requesting this as soon as possible for timely processing. To ensure sufficient processing time, it is advised to request your Visa Support Letter by 3 May. While requests made after this date will still be processed and a Visa Support Letter provided, the timely arrival of visas cannot be guaranteed. Upon completion of registration, the Visa Support Letter will be made available through the registration portal, and you will be notified via email.

Holders of passports issued by the countries, entities or territories listed on [this webpage](#) are granted visa-free travel to Hungary.

Before requesting the Visa Support Letter, identify the embassy or consulate where you will apply for the visa. The visa application process and detailed steps are available on [this webpage](#).

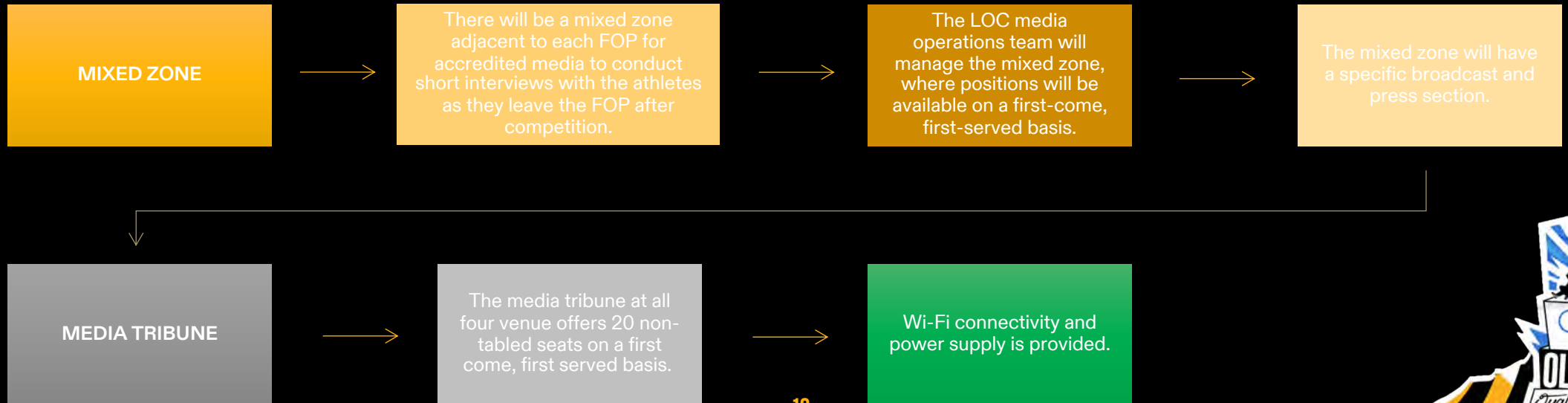
6.4 Olympic Information Services (OIS)

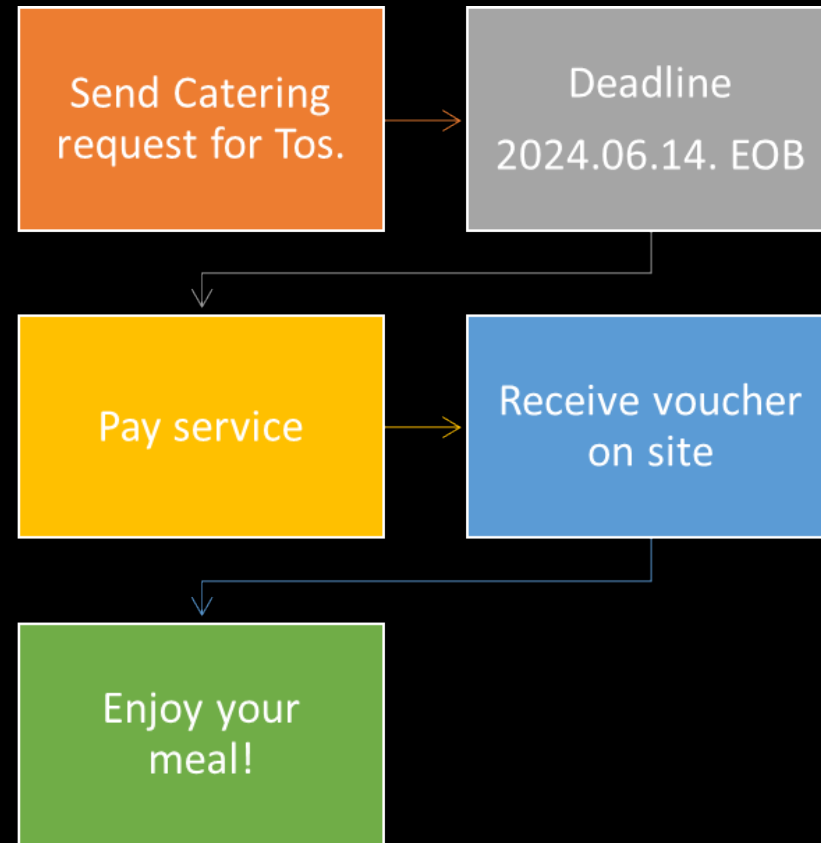

MEDICAL AND ANTI-DOPING

9.1 Service available

Urgent and Emergency Care medical services have been established for the Olympic Qualifier Series to ensure the safety of all stakeholders.

This includes a standby hospital equipped with CT and surgical carts, capable of conducting radiological investigations and immediate life-saving surgical interventions; four medical points established within the competition venues supported by appropriately qualified healthcare staff; further medical points will be set up in public areas, offering basic medical services to both spectators and staff. For emergencies requiring rapid transport, a fleet of ambulances will be deployed across the Urban Park to transport to either the on-site emergency care mobile units or onward to the designated hospital.

9.2 Physio

Designated area is available for physio service at the athletes club area.

9.4 Doping control

There will be a designated Anti-doping area within the venue.

9.5 Insurance

All accredited persons must have accident, health, and repatriation insurance to cover their medical expenses in the host city/country.

It is the responsibility of the participating individuals and/or the NF to arrange insurance to provide coverage for their health or injuries during travel to and from the Olympic Qualifier Series Event, as well as throughout the event. The insurance should cover the risks associated with claims by third parties, personal injury, bodily injury or death. Kindly ensure you take the appropriate actions to meet these obligations well ahead of time.

9.6 Ambulance

Ambulance services are available to facilitate a swift medical response.

9.7. Medical services during official training at venue

During all official training times, medical services will operate at the training venue. No medical services will be provided by the event organization outside the official training times. In case of an emergency, call 112 for assistance.



SECURITY

Security measures are implemented to ensure a safe and secure environment for all stakeholder at the Olympic Qualifier Series.

10.1 Entry to the Event

1. Entry to the Event is free for all Visitors.
2. Visitors and delegation members that are under the age of 16 may enter the Event only when accompanied by either a Chaperone (adult) or the International Federation designated Safeguarding Focal Point.
3. Pursuant to Act CXXXIII of 2005 on the Rules of Personal and Property Protection and Private Investigation, the Organiser is entitled to verify the identity of Visitors, conduct a limited body search and search the bags of visitors upon entry, prevent specified items from being brought into the Event venue, and request the departure of individuals disrupting the Event.
4. Each person is allowed to bring 1 handbag/backpack no larger than A4 size (29,7x21 cm) into the Event venue.
5. Sports equipment (e.g. bicycles, skateboards, roller skates, etc.) may be brought into the Event venue and used at designated areas at one's own risk.
6. For safety reasons, it is strictly prohibited to bring the following items into the Event venue: alcoholic beverages, drugs, pyrotechnic devices, fragile objects, umbrellas, items containing explosive or flammable materials such as fireworks, gasoline and alcohol, toxic materials, hazardous chemicals, radioactive materials, firearms, ammunition, simulated guns, crossbows, bows and arrows, daggers, sharp objects, piercing or cutting tools (excluding for staff/contractors, athletes/teams), gas sprays, radio equipment, megaphones and items that interfere with wireless communication signals, cluster signals or hinder the Event, laser devices, drones or any other objects considered dangerous to public safety, as specified in Government Decree 175/2003. (X. 28.) on particularly dangerous items or prohibited by Hungarian laws and regulations.

party may prohibit or restrict additional items deemed to pose a safety risk to Visitors and participants of the Event.

8. Food and beverages (in reusable flasks or bottles) for personal use may be brought into the Event venue.
9. Entry of motor vehicles, including electric vehicles (e.g. e-scooter, Segway, etc.), into the Event venue is prohibited during opening hours. Entry is only permitted for service traffic with an entry permit issued by the Organiser, in compliance with the rules of the Highway Code.
10. Only official flags of countries participating in the OQS are allowed into the Event venue, provided they do not exceed 2 metres × 1 metre, when unfolded, and flagpoles are no longer than 1 metre. The flags may only display the names of the official cities of the respective countries and no other text.
11. Visitors may not bring in or wear banners, slogans, billboards, third party advertising, flags, or other items bearing propaganda, hate speech, political, racial, religious or commercial content, symbols of authoritarianism or any symbols banned by law.
11. The entry of professional photography or video equipment and live streaming applications is prohibited unless prior permission has been granted by the Organiser.
12. It is prohibited to bring animals into the Event area, except for assistance dogs, guide dogs for the visually impaired, and police dogs as defined by law.

11.1.3 Use of NF/NOC Emblem

As an exception for the Olympic Qualifier Series (not the Olympic Games Paris 2024), one NF emblem could be included on uniforms in addition to, or instead of, the NOC emblem. If the uniform has the NOC and NF emblem, the NF emblem should be no more prominent than the NOC emblem. If there is no NOC emblem, there is no size restriction applied to the NF emblem. The NF emblem must not include a commercial logo.

The use of the NOC emblem is subject to prior approval by the respective NOC. This could include either (i) the institutional or (ii) the commercial emblem of a participating NOC, as approved by the IOC, or the emblem of the NF, as approved by the respective IF.

11.1.4 Compliance

IFs have the overall responsibility of ensuring compliance with these guidelines whilst on the FOP (training, warm-up and competition), podium and mixed zones. The LOC is responsible for ensuring compliance outside of these areas. Additionally, NFs must ensure that their delegation is informed sufficiently in advance about these guidelines and complies with them.

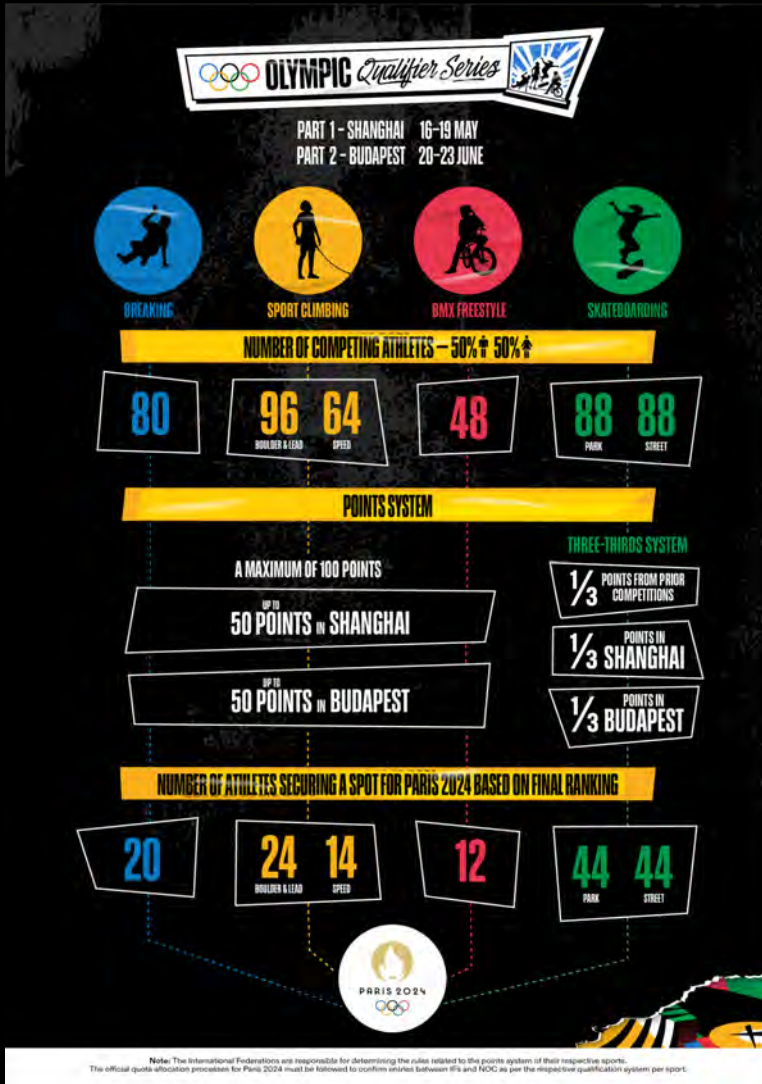

12.2 Qualification and points system

The Olympic Qualifier Series serves as the ultimate qualification stage on the road to Paris 2024 for BMX freestyle, breaking, skateboarding and sport climbing. In total, over 150 quota places for Paris 2024 will be allocated following the Series in accordance with the relevant qualification systems.

The Olympic Qualifier Series employs a points system designed to determine which athletes will secure quota places for Paris 2024. The International Federations are responsible for determining the rules related to the points system of their respective sports.

Athletes in BMX freestyle, sport climbing, and breaking will compete for a maximum of 50 points at each of the events in Shanghai and Budapest, making a maximum possible total of 100 points per athlete. Points from both stops will be compiled into a ranking for each of the sports, that will determine which athletes earn quota places for Paris 2024.

For skateboarding, the points system is divided into three parts: results from prior competitions and the results from the Shanghai and Budapest Olympic Qualifier Series events respectively. One-third of the points are allocated from past competitions, while the remaining two-thirds will be up for grabs in Shanghai and Budapest. The combined points from all competitions will give the final ranking.

Please note that Paris 2024 quota numbers that are being used in our communications are a projection for participation based on estimations in collaboration with the International Federations. Following the Olympic Qualifier Series event in Budapest, which is the last event in the respective qualification process, 150+ quota places will be allocated. The exact breakdown, determination and timing of these allocations will be in accordance with the relevant Qualification System.

The official quota allocation processes will have to be followed to confirm entries between IFs and NOCs as per the Olympic Charter and respective qualification system for each sport. This, or any future, communication and/or promotional activities from any third party, including NFs, IFs, NOCs and/or the IOC in relation to the Olympic Qualifier Series, including regarding quota places, are not official or binding and do not supersede the sport's qualification system.

FESTIVAL AND CEREMONIES

The Olympic Qualifier Series is not just a qualification event, it is a new Olympic experience for athletes and fans around the world. The Urban Festival complements the sports competition and comprises a series of activities related to music, arts, and culture, and reflects an urban sports lifestyle and showcases the energy and creativity of Budapest.

7.1 Festival area

The festival area will encompass the surrounding of the Urban Park, providing visitors with entertainment, various services and activities. Between the fields of play, spaces will feature a merchandise store, a Paris 2024 booth, free-of-charge adventure park, and areas for sport demonstrations. All the FoP has its own sport initiation area. There will be BMX and skateboard service point for pro and visitor riders as well. Plus there is a 'Lifestyle Village' where you can try other, relevant sports e.g.: 3X3 basketball, teqball, bike trial, snowboard for small kids, pump track, etc.

7.2 Sports initiation

As part of the Urban Festival, a sports initiation programme focused on the Olympic Qualifier Series sports will be managed by the LOC. It gives spectators the chance to learn about, play and engage with the different sports. Sports initiation will take place in a dedicated zone in the Urban Park. Sport initiation areas will be in close proximity to the field of play of each respective sport.

7.3 Victory ceremonies

The victory ceremony is staged after each final to honour athletes who place first, second and third and to award trophies. The ceremony is held immediately after the event at the competition venue. Finalist athletes' flags will show at the LED wall of the FoP-s.

After each victory ceremony on Saturday and Sunday (small exceptions see comp. schedule) there will be straight away a second ceremony where all athletes that have earned a spot for the Olympic Summer Games Paris 2024 will be handed a gift and be celebrated.

Don't miss it: All athletes that have earned a spot for Paris 2024 are asked to be on site for the ceremony and meet in the call area straight before the victory ceremony starts.



HOSPITALITY

1 Hospitality lounges

The LOC will provide Olympic Qualifier Series Guests.

Olympic Qualifier Series Guests, including IOC members, International Federations' representatives, and governmental officials, will have access to a partially indoor hospitality area located in and in front of the Campus Building. This area will be separate from public access, ensuring privacy and exclusivity.

Hospitality areas will operate from 10:00 to 21:00 during the competition days.

2 Services

Hospitality groups will benefit from approximately 50 parking spaces and a registration tent at a separate entry to the venue, designed to streamline access and enhance convenience. Additionally, dedicated seating at the grandstands will be available on a first-come, first-serve basis, ensuring that guests have the opportunity to enjoy the competitions comfortably and conveniently.



TICKETING

13.1 Spectator tickets

The event in Budapest will be fully non-ticketed, allowing open access to the public without the need for tickets.

13.2 Seating areas

Seating areas is also free of charge.

13.3 Athletes' viewing area

Athletes will be able to watch all sports competitions free of charge from a designated area within the grandstands. It is important to note that seating is on a first-come, first-served basis, subject to availability and capacity, and a seat is not guaranteed.



TRANSPORT

14.1 Athletes flight booking procedure

Athletes and NFs are responsible for making their own travel arrangements. To offset the costs associated with travel of accredited athletes to the Olympic Qualifier Series, a travel grant system will be in place to support the athletes to travel to the events. IFs will be responsible for providing the funds to the NFs/athletes. Athletes should contact their National Federation for more details.

14.2 Arrivals and departure

For accredited individuals attending the Olympic Qualifier Series in Budapest, the designated port of entry is Liszt Ferenc International Airport. Transfers from this airport to the designated OQS hotels will be coordinated based on the details provided in the accreditation system.

Additional Ports of Entry: For groups arriving from neighboring countries by train, transfers from major train stations to their respective hotels will be arranged. However, dedicated staff will not be permanently stationed at these locations; they will be present only to meet the specific arrivals of these groups. The train stations used for these transfers are Keleti Pályaudvar and Nyugati Pályaudvar.

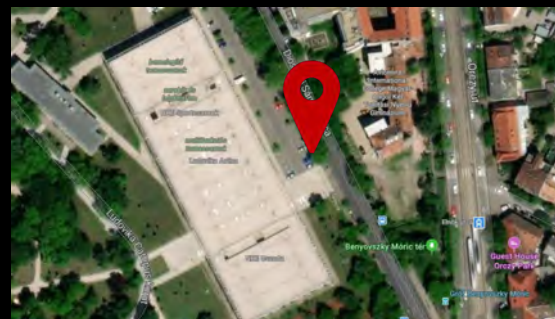

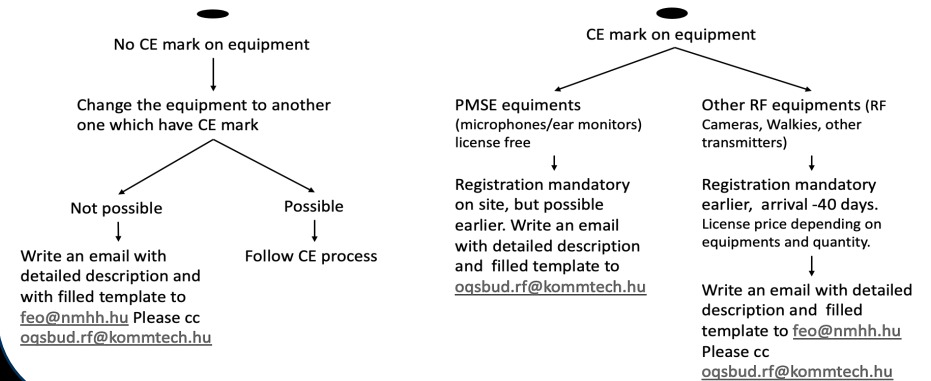
15.3 Radio frequencies

SPORT COMPETITION FORMATS

Breaking

Pre-Selection

- The 40 athletes are seeded into 10 heats.
- Each athlete in the heat performs individually and is scored by each judge on a scale of 0 to 100 (0.1-point increments). The highest and lowest judge scores are discarded, and the remaining scores averaged to give a final score of 0 to 100.
- The 40 athletes are ranked based on pre-selection score and event seeding.
- The top 32 ranked athletes advance to the Pre-Qualifier phase.
- The remaining athletes are eliminated and ranked based on their Pre-Selection ranking.

Pre-Qualifier:

- The athletes are seeded into 16 battles.
- Each knock-out battle consists of two rounds plus an additional round if both athletes have won the same number of rounds and votes during the battle.
- The athletes are assigned to red and blue sides by random draw.
- The 16 battle winners advance to the Round Robin phase and are seeded for the Round Robin based on rounds won in Pre-Qualifier (excluding any additional third rounds), votes won in Pre-Qualifier (excluding any from any additional third rounds), Pre-Selection ranking and finally by pre-competition seeding.

Round Robin:

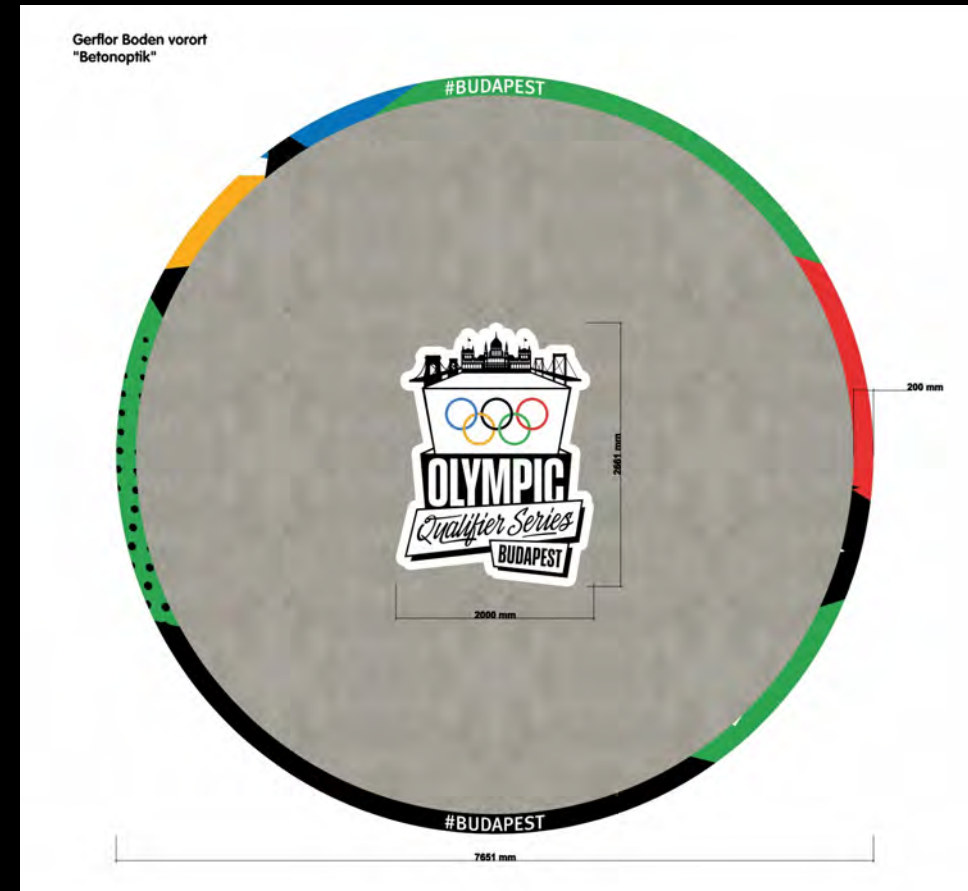
- There are four groups of four athletes. Each athlete competes in three battles in the Round Robin. The group composition is determined based on Pre-Qualifier Ranking:
 - Group A: 1, 8, 9, 16
 - Group B: 2, 7, 10, 15
 - Group C: 3, 6, 11, 14
 - Group D: 4, 5, 12, 13
- The order of battles within each group is determined by the "battle pools" defined in the WDSF Breaking Rules and Regulations Manual.
- In each battle, athletes are assigned to the red or blue side by computerised random draw
- Each battle consists of two rounds. In all battles, the athlete designated as "Blue" can decide whether to perform first, or to allow their opponent "Red" to perform first. The second athlete then responds.
- During the Round Robin, scores become available at the end of each round.
- Athletes are ranked within each group by the number of rounds won and judges' votes collected and finally by Pre-Selection Ranking.
- At the end of the Round Robin, the best two athletes in each group progress to the Quarterfinals. The remaining athletes are ranked 9th to 16th, by the number of rounds won, the number of votes collected, Pre-Selection Ranking and finally by pre-competition seeding.



SPORT COMPETITION FORMATS

Knock-out:

- Each Knock-out battle consists of three rounds. The athlete with more rounds at the end of the battle is declared the winner.
- In each battle, athletes are assigned to the red or blue side depending on their position in the bracket.
- During the Knock-out, scores become available at the end of the battle.
- The athlete designated as "Blue" can decide whether to perform first, or to allow their opponent "Red" to perform first. The second athlete then responds.
- The losing quarterfinalists are ranked 5th to 8th by the total number of rounds won in the Knock-out, total number of votes collected in the Knock-out, rounds won in the Round Robin, votes collected in the Round Robin, Pre-Qualifier Ranking, Pre-Selection Ranking and finally by pre-competition seeding.
- The losing semi-finalists contest the bronze medal battle, and the winning semi-finalists contest the gold medal battle.

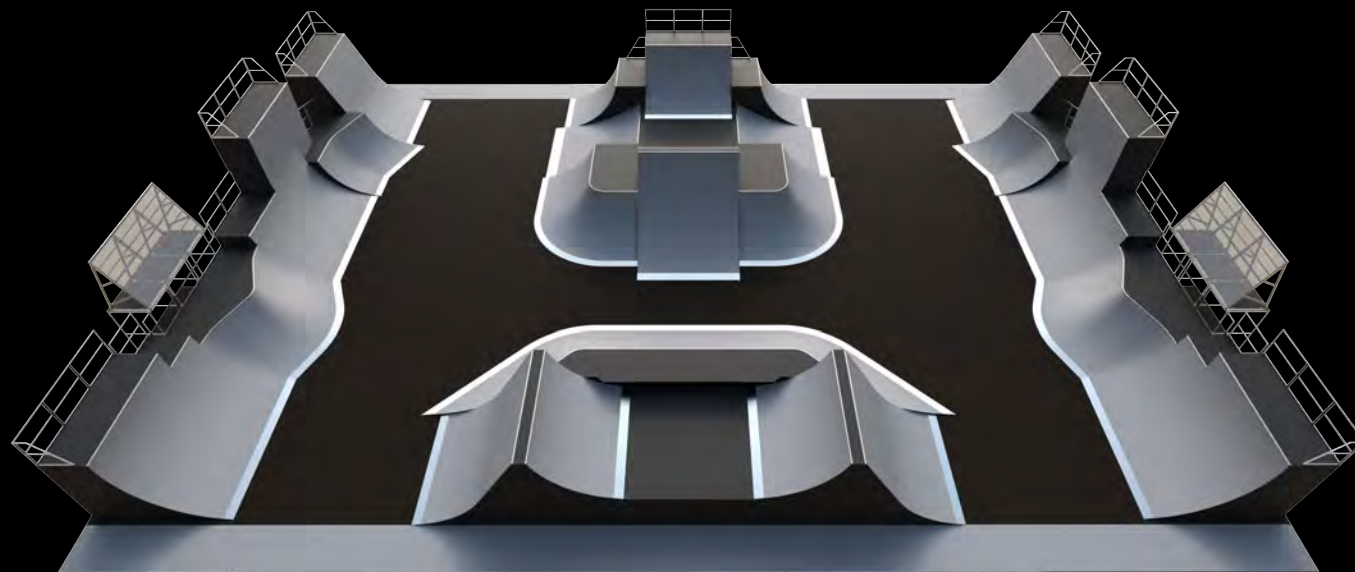
BMX freestyle

Qualification

- The 24 female or male riders compete in four heats of 6 riders.
- The start order in each heat will be provided by the UCI (based on the UCI Ranking).
- Riders perform 2 runs per heat, in the same start order.
- The rider's result is calculated on the average score of the two runs.
- The first 12 riders from the combined ranking of the Qualification heats qualify to the Final.

Final

- The start order of the Final is based on the reverse order of the Qualification results, with the riders ranked 7-12 placed in the first heat, and the riders ranked 1-6 placed in the second heat.
- Should the final be cancelled, the Qualification ranking will stand as the event result.



SPORT COMPETITION FORMATS

Sport climbing

Boulder & Lead

- Athletes compete in two stages that are combined into a single ranking. The event comprises three phases, Qualification, Semifinal and Final, each with a Boulder and a Lead stage.
- 20 athletes progress from Qualification to Semifinals. In case of tie for the 20th place, both will progress to the Semifinals.
- At the end of the Semifinal phase, the eight highest ranked athletes progress to the Final phase. The athlete with the highest Final ranking, combining points from Boulder and Lead stages, will win the competition. Points are not carried over from the Semifinal phase to the Final phase.

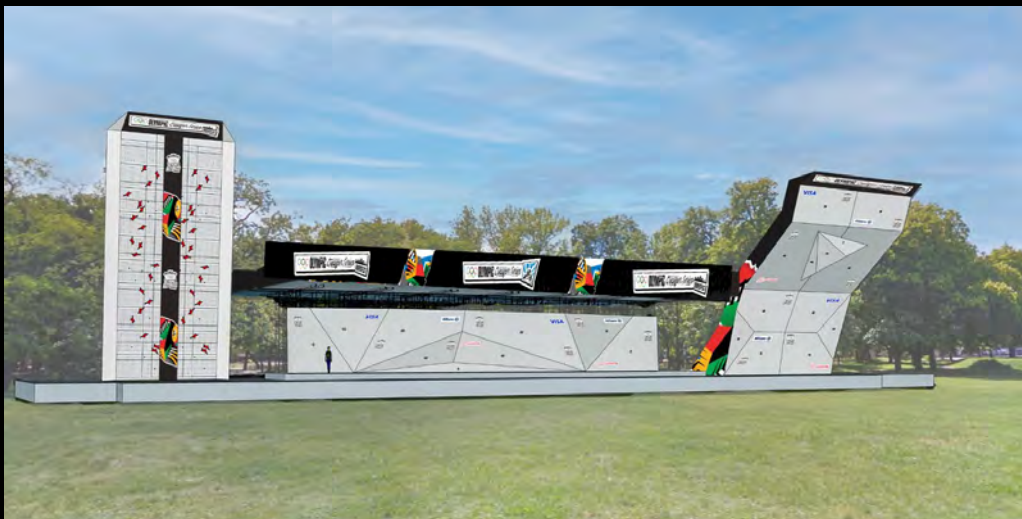
Speed

Qualification

- Each athlete may make two runs, one on Lane A (the left lane) and one on Lane B (the right lane). Any athlete failing to make at least one attempt will not be ranked in the phase.
- The starting order for the seeding heats is randomised. Half the start list start on Lane A, the second half on Lane B, changing lanes after the first run.
- Any athlete recording a False Start will be ranked last in the phase. However, they will not keep their other race result (obtained in Lane A or Lane B) to split their ranking.

Final Phase

- The Final phase consists of a series of elimination rounds: 1/8 Finals, Quarterfinals, Semifinals, Finals (Small and Big Final).
- In each round, the winner of each heat progresses to the next round and the loser is eliminated.
